The multiplier event of the GreenGenerations project in Greece

At the end of March, **Stimmuli for Social Change**, with the support of the **1st Primary School of Alexandreia**, had the pleasure of organizing and implementing the **multiplier event** of the **GreenGenerations project**. The event took place at the **Folklore Cultural Association of Alexandria** and aimed to introduce key concepts related to **intergenerational education**, while also showcasing the **main results and achievements** of the GreenGenerations project.

The primary goal of the GreenGenerations multiplier event was to introduce participants to the concept of intergenerational learning for sustainability, to present the key results of the GreenGenerations project, and to provide practical guidance on how to implement the GreenGenerations Curriculum in classroom settings.

The workshop was designed to be **interactive**, encouraging participants to ask questions, share their experiences, and reflect on how climate education can be enriched through intergenerational collaboration.

In the first part of the event, **Stimmuli for Social Change** presented the **objectives**, **methodology**, **and outcomes** of the GreenGenerations project, with a focus on the **Greek version of the GreenGenerations Curriculum** and the accompanying **Teacher Training Package**. Following this, the **1st Primary School of Alexandreia (1st PSA)** shared the **results from the piloting phase**, presenting their experience and insights to the participants.

Participants appreciated that the curriculum and all material offer detailed instructions for parents, teachers and students, along with flexible activities and supporting materials and the platform that can be used in both online and offline learning environments.

The event concluded with an interactive **role-playing activity**, where participants took on the roles of community members, exploring challenges and interests related to climate change. **GreenGenerations once again highlighted the vital role of education in the transition toward a greener and more responsible future**.
